A SEWERLINE BREAK HAPPENED! AGAIN!

n the early hours of March 18, 2010, two homeowners suffered considerable damage to their homes due to a sewer line break. The foul backup was caused by hygiene items having been improperly flushed down the building's waste line, which resulted in the entire wasteline contents of Willow Street backing up into these two units.

COSTLY CORRECTIVE MEASURES TAKEN

The association dispatched emergency plumbing and environmental clean up crews to the affected properties. That coupled with insurance liability awards totaled nearly \$5,000.

RECAP OF THE DPWA OPEN MEETING

ere is a recap of the Droyers Point Walkway Association (DPWA) open meeting, held April 14, 2010:

—The Friends of the Walkway gave a presentation detailing how rubber or small, individual concrete pavers could be used on the walkway, instead of cutting down the mature trees which now line it. After hearing the proposal, The DWPA board gave the Friends one month to obtain hard figures as to what their alternative proposal would cost.

--Residents expressed concern that the key fob controlled electronic gates were not programmed to allow residents of all three communities access on and off the walkway.

SHI Manager Alexis Buhl, who is overseeing the project, promised that all gates would be programmed to allow all residents access on and off the walkway by the end of April 2010.

—Two Jersey City "Urban Renewal" officials presented the city's future plans for creating additional communities, commercial spaces and more pedestrianfriendly access along Routes 440 and 1&9T.

KITCHEN


Make a checklist and clean the areas you rarely touch: under the fridge, top of the oven hood, baseboard and window moldings, light fixtures and under countertop appliances.


